Here are a few Christmas favourites that always get made in our house every year. The cheese stars and the gingerbread are served with our Christmas teas and I make the wreaths for gifts and a special teatime treat for ourselves.

Wishing you all a very Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year.

CRANBERRY & PISTACHIO WREATH COOKIES

These cookies are easy to make and make a lovely gift. Just pop in a cellophane bag and tie with a ribbon.

INGREDIENTS:

Basic shortbread recipe

60g Caster sugar.

125g butter.

185g plain flour.

To decorate:

Large bar of white chocolate. Dried cranberries chopped.

Dried Cramberries Chop

Pistachios chopped.



METHOD:

To make the shortbread, rub the butter into the flour until it resembles breadcrumbs then mix in the sugar. Continue to work the mixture with your hands bringing it together to form a soft dough. Wrap in cling firm and chill for 30 minutes.

On a floured surface, roll out your dough to 1/4 inch thick. Then using a large cookie cutter cut out your discs then using a small cutter cut out the middle to form your wreath shape.

Transfer to a lined baking sheet and bake for 15 minutes at 170 until just lightly golden in colour. Leave to cool completely. Carefully melt the white chocolate in a heatproof bowl over a pan of simmering water. (White chocolate needs to be melted gently as it can burn very easily).

One at a time, dip the tops of the cookies into the melted chocolate and place on a wire rack. Before the chocolate sets, sprinkle the cookies with a mixture of the cranberries and pistachios.

CHEESE STARS

This is your standard cheese straw recipe but cut into star shapes for Christmas. They are the perfect accompaniment with drinks, served alongside soup, or straight out of the oven while they are still warm!

INGREDIENTS:

280g self-raising flour. 280g mature cheddar grated. 6 oz. butter.

2 eggs.

Large teaspoon of mustard, English, Dijon or wholegrain. Good grind of black pepper.



METHOD:

In a large bowl, rub the butter into the flour then thoroughly mix in the cheese. Whisk the eggs together with the mustard and black pepper then add to the dry mix and work in with your hands to form a soft dough. The mixture will be fairly sticky so dust your hands with extra flour for easier handling. Wrap in cling film and chill for 30 minutes.

On a floured surface roll out the dough to 1/4 inch thick and either cut out star shapes or cut into 1cm by 6 cm strips to make a classic cheese straw. Place on a lined baking tray and brush with beaten egg.

Bake for 20 minutes at 190 until well risen and golden

STICKY GINGERBREAD

This is a good one to make in advance as it freezes very well.

INGREDIENTS:

150g butter.

200g golden syrup.

200g black treacle or molasses.

125g dark muscovado sugar.

3 teaspoons ground ginger.

1 teaspoon ground cinnamon.

250ml milk.

2 eggs, beaten.

300g plain flour.

1/4 teaspoon of ground cloves.

1 teaspoon bicarbonate of soda, dissolved in 2×15 ml tablespoons warm water.

METHOD:

Preheat the oven to 170° C/gas mark 3 and line a roasting tin or ovenproof dish (approx. $30\text{cm} \times 20\text{cm} \times 5\text{cm}$) baking parchment. In a saucepan, melt the butter over a lowish heat along with the sugar, syrup, treacle, ginger, cinnamon and cloves.

Take off the heat, and add the milk, eggs and dissolved bicarbonate of soda in its water.

Measure the flour into a bowl and pour in the liquid ingredients, beating until well mixed. It will be a very liquid batter, so don't worry. This is part of what makes it sticky later.

Pour it into the prepared tin and bake for 45-60 minutes until

risen and firm on top. Try not to overcook, as it is nicer a little stickier. Transfer the tin to a wire rack and let the gingerbread cool in the tin before cutting into 20 squares, or however you wish to slice it.

Either serve as it is or add a little icing and a piece of stem ginger to decorate.

The Pulpí Geode Guide

As the cooler winter months arrive, many of our local outdoor activities are now closed, making it the perfect time to step off the beaten path and explore some of the region's lesser-known wonders.

As the founder of the newly launched Mojácar Life, I'm committed to uncovering and sharing these lesser-known treasures. MojacarLife.com is a new online website dedicated to showcasing the unique attractions and experiences across the region so be sure to check it out!

Today, I'm excited to guide you beyond the typical beach destinations and introduce you to a remarkable geological marvel – the Pulpí Geode.

DISCOVERING THE PULPÍ GEODE

This now world-famous & record-breaking geode was discovered in 1990 and has only been open to the public since 2019. Located in Pulpí, near San Juan de los Terreros it is considered the largest visitable single-crystal geode in the world.

The geode, composed of Gypsum – a mineral abundant in the area and used in everything from plasterboard to fertilizer – really is a sight to behold. Did you know Almería produces 20% of Europe's gypsum!?

BOOKING YOUR VISIT

To book, head over to geodapulpi.es or just Google it. The online booking process is reasonably user-friendly and partially in English. Adult tickets are currently at \in 22 and children's tickets (ages 8-16) at \in 10. Advance booking is REQUIRED.

Consider renting the headphones at reception when you arrive for an English-guided tour as it provides a much deeper insight into the history of the mine.

THE JOURNEY, WHAT TO BRING & WEAR

Since there's no direct public transport to the geode, driving is your best option. The scenic coastal route between Villaricos & San Juan offers breath-taking ocean views. Dress for comfort: sturdy shoes and clothes suitable for walking and some stair climbing are ideal. The mine's temperature is cool in summer and typically warmer than outside in winter. A small bottle of water is also recommended.

THE GEODE EXPERIENCE

Your fascinating 90-minute geode tour begins at the main entrance of the mine where you'll be given a hard hat and a quick briefing.

The mine is all well-maintained, well-lit, and extremely safe, but, be aware that the ceiling beams can be quite low and the corridors are reasonably narrow (don't worry, there aren't any



'tight spaces' you have to squeeze through).

As your small tour group (normally 6-8 people) follows the guide through the mine tunnels, you'll be taken around all the various passages that fully showcase the history of the mine, known locally as 'La Mina Rica', which translates to 'The Rich Mine'.

You'll bear witness to old relics left behind by the miners whilst your guide regularly stops to discuss how they lived, the types of minerals they extracted, and their methods (this is where renting the English headset at the reception comes in handy).

In your final descent, you will reach an extremely large spiral staircase. This is the most challenging part of the tour but there is a small 1-person (very slow) lift that can be used by anyone not up for the walk.

Reaching the geode, here, you can lean into the geode as the guide illuminates it, revealing a breathtaking display of light through clear crystals.

When the lights come on, it really is a sight to behold that will leave your mouth wide open as you stare in awe!

Finally, once your group has all had their turn, it's time to return to the surface (yep, via the stairs!).

CONCLUSION

As a major highlight of visiting the area (it's one of few year-round activities here), it's an experience I highly recommend to everyone who's physically able to do it:) and hopefully this guide has inspired you to get out there and explore it!

Each month I am looking forward to sharing my knowledge of hair care with you. As a Vocational Trainer and Assessor for the examiners SCOTVEC and a salon owner for over 30 years, my passion is the science of hair and how to respect it using salon

I will be giving you some useful tips and advice on how you can protect and care for your hair and how to make the most of your crowning glory.

Perms are making a big comeback. Each month the number of clients asking for a light perm are increasing. Christmas is around the corner and clients are wanting fine, flyaway, lifeless hair to have some body, bounce and movement. A perm can last up to approximately twelve weeks, however the looser the perm the less time it will last.

Using larger rollers and the correct perming lotion, hair can be transformed. One of my clients asked a few questions regarding her perm. I hope this article helps anyone who is thinking of having a perm but is still undecided.

WHY DOES PERM LOTION SMELL SO BAD?

A) Perm lotion has a chemical called ammonia thioglycolate, it is the ammonia that you can smell. This chemical breaks bonds within the hair and allows us to reshape them.

Providing the perm lotion is rinsed thoroughly from the hair once the curl is achieved it can be less smelly. Perm lotions are not as smelly as they once were as perfumes have been added to hide the smell.

If the smell absolutely gets to you and you cannot stand it anymore, you can rinse your hair thoroughly at home with water, only for a couple of minutes in the shower.

Q) HOW LONG DO I HAVE TO WAIT BEFORE I CAN WASH MY HAIR AFTER MY PERM?

A) Perm lotion breaks down important bonds within the hair, the neutraliser is used after the perming process to rebuild these bonds, however, only approximately 75% of the bonds are knitted back together by the neutraliser. The remaining bonds in your hair will naturally start to knit back over the next few days, so it's important not to wash your hair for the first 3 days after your perm.

Q) CAN I PERM MY HAIR IF IT IS ARTIFICIALLY COLOURED? AND HOW LONG DO I HAVE TO WAIT BEFORE I PERM MY HAIR AFTER A COLOUR?

A) Yes, you can perm over artificially coloured hair, however, hair that has been bleached can become dry and brittle. Your colour

> will lighten slightly as the neutraliser used in the perming process contains a chemical called hydrogen peroxide which can take out some of the colour molecules within the hair. It is best to have your hair permed before a colour treatment, if you decide you would like a perm after a colour, I would recommend waiting approximately 3 days. Your hairdresser can do an assessment on your hair to ensure they use the correct perming lotion for colour treated hair.


BOOK REVIEW
