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Spring is in the air and thoughts turn to lighter options for supper. Living by the sea we are lucky to have an abundance of fresh fish on our doorstep and nothing is more tasty and easy to prepare than a nice fillet of sea bass. So here is oven baked sea bass served with patatas a lo pobre and a zingy salsa verde. In line with the zesty flavours and, also one of our most popular starter choices at La Meseta, chilli & lime marinated prawns with a mango salsa. Plus who can resist using the rest of the mango to make a delicious fool? Not me!

CHILLI AND LIME MARINATED PRAWNS WITH A MANGO SALSA SERVES 2

Ingredients:

8-10 large cooked prawns unpeeled 1/2 red chilli 1 lime 1/2 large mango finely diced 1/2 small red onion finely chopped Handful of fresh chopped

with parsley if preferred)

coriander (this can be substituted



Method:

Peel and de-vein the prawns and place into a small bowl. Thinly slice and add the chilli plus the zest and juice of half the lime. Mix together and cover and leave to marinate in the fridge for at least 2 hours.

The salsa can also be made now and will sit happily in the fridge until ready to serve. Mix together the diced mango, chopped onion and coriander with the juice of the remaining lime half. Cover and refrigerate.

To serve, divide the salsa between 2 plates and add the prawns on top and garnish with lime wedges

OVEN BAKED SEA BASS & PATATAS A LO POBRE SERVES 2

Ingredients:

1 to 2 sea bass fillets per person depending on size

2 large white potatoes sliced into 1/2 cm thick pieces - the skins can be left on

1/2 large red pepper sliced into strips

Medium white onion sliced then cut into half moons

Vegetable stock cube crumbled as

finely as possible

Black pepper Olive oil for roasting

Method:

Lay the sliced potatoes, onions and pepper in a shallow roasting tin and sprinkle over the stock cube and plenty of black pepper. Add around 3 tablespoons of olive oil and give it all a good mix - using your hands is easiest, then spread out evenly. Bake in the oven at 200 degrees for around 40 minutes or until the potatoes are cooked and starting to brown. At this point, the sea bass can go in and as it takes literally 10 minutes to cook, the potatoes will sit happily in the oven for this time.

To cook the sea bass lay a piece of tin foil on a baking sheet and lightly oil or butter it. Season your sea bass with salt and pepper and lay flesh side down on the foil. Then just 10-12 minutes in the hottest part of the oven.

Serve the fish on top of the potatoes and add a little salsa verde if desired.

SALSA VERDE

Ingredients:

4 tinned anchovy fillets in oil, drained

- 1 tablespoon capers in vinegar, drained
- 1/2 teaspoon Dijon mustard
- 1 small clove garlic, crushed
- 1¹/₂ tablespoons lemon juice
- 6 tablespoons olive oil

2 tablespoons chopped fresh parsley

Salt and freshly milled black pepper

Method:

Chop the anchovy fillets as small as possible and crush them to a paste. Put the capers in a small sieve and rinse them under cold, running water to remove the vinegar they were preserved in. Dry them on kitchen paper and chop them as minutely as you can and add them to the anchovies.

Next, add the mustard, garlic, lemon juice and some freshly milled black pepper and mix well. Add the oil and chopped parsley mix again. Taste and add salt as required.

And finally mango & lime fool anyone? So quick and simple and not to mention utterly delicious!

MANGO & LIME FOOL

Ingredients: 1/2 diced ripe mango Grated zest and juice of ½ lime

100ml double cream 2 tsp. icing sugar Tablespoon Greek yogurt **Method:**

Mix together the mango, lime zest and lime juice and add the icing sugar. Lightly whip the cream to very soft peaks, it will thicken when mixed with the lime and stir into the fruit along with the yoghurt. Continue to mix



together until it is no longer sloppy. Check for sweetness and add a little more sugar if needed. Divide between serving dishes, I use cocktail glasses for this type of dessert and add a little lime zest to garnish. Can be served with a biscuit or 2 if desired.



IT STARTS WITH A ROOSTER



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

GARDENING TIPS IN SOUTHERN SPAIN

While we would all love to have a large garden to tend, some of us must make do with only a balcony or terrace.

Outdoor potted plants are a wonderful way to create a lush and vibrant outdoor oasis and, growing outdoor potted plants in Southern Spain can be a rewarding experience, given the region's abundant sunlight and relatively mild winters. 

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

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Welcome to your monthly hair dot com

Each month I am looking forward to sharing my knowledge of hair care with you. As a Vocational Trainer and Assessor for the examiners SCOTVEC and a salon owner for over 30 years, my passion is the science of hair and how to respect it using salon chemicals.

I will be giving you some useful tips and advice on how you can protect and care for your hair and how to make the most of your crowning glory.

WHY DOES MY HAIR STAND UP AT THE TOP?

Ever wondered why some hairdressers like to sit you in the chair before they wash your hair? simple, we like to see how your hair grows without water weighing it down. We can see the direction that your hair grows, whether you have a napes whorle or if you have a double crown, high crown or a calf's lick at the front. Also to give you the opportunity to inform us of any problem areas.

Human hair grows naturally in different ways, and knowing how yours grows can pay off when it comes to a new haircut.

It may seem useless to know if your hair grows in one direction, if you have one or more whorls or if a section of your hair usually stands up, but to hairdresser this can mean a lot. Hairdressers have the experience to suggest how to wear your hair to complement it and to make life easier working with your hair growth patterns.

WHAT ARE HAIR GROWTH PATTERNS?

Hair growth patterns are nothing more than the natural way that your hair grows. The hair growth pattern is determined by genetics. If you can look at your parent's hair growth patterns you will find similarities in the way yours grows. Hair grows in two main directions: following the clock's needles or against them, it is known as hair flow, this is considered by hairdresser before cutting. However, when the hair grows in opposite directions in several areas, a stubborn whorl occurs.

Hair whorls are strands of hair that grow in the opposite direction to the rest of the hair. They generally do so in a circular or spiral shape and often appear on the crown, some people call this their 'crown'. It is usual to have a single whorl that ultimately determines the main hair growth direction. Still, many people have up to 3 'crowns', with some smaller than others.

Your hairdresser will usually cut the hair in the direction of the dominant one.

TYPES OF HAIR GROWTH PATTERNS

Cows-lick: Cows-lick refers to hair growing in only one direction, which is usually not curved. It tends to



look up and stick out when cut too far. It appears in the front hairline or near, although it can also appear anywhere.

Double crown: Someone has a double crown when there are two spirals (whorls) in the parietal area of the head (upper part). They are often quite difficult to handle when cutting.

Widow's peak: Mature hairline widow's peak hair. Here the hairline meets in a V-shape downward, descending across the forehead and giving a V-like appearance. The receding hairline is also a cause of widow's peak in men; this reveals a prominent 'U' or 'V' on the forehead, commonly known as 'hair recesses.' It is common in cases of male pattern baldness.

Whorl: Whorl hair - As we already mentioned, whorl or spirals are hair that grows in the opposite direction to the natural one, frequently forming a spiral on the crown or upper part of the head. A single person can have multiple whorls.

Ducktail: A Ducktail is known because hair grows towards the nape forming a V. It is similar to the widow's peak but to the opposite sides.

Hair growth patterns determine the way your hair grows concerning direction, areas, and length. When the stylist knows how your hair naturally grows, they can provide you a haircut according to this pattern so that when your hair grows out, you can wear a versatile look that suits your face every day.



We are both in our late Fifties. My wife insists that all of my allowance is paid into her account to help cover the mortgage and our bills. I have asked her if we can talk about selling our house to get something smaller and on the flat as my condition is progressing. This would mean we could clear our mortgage, buy another house outright and have a bit to put by, but she won't even discuss it. My wife said I don't need to know about our finances anymore and she will handle everything. I feel worse than useless now, it's bad enough that I can't work but it feels like I have no right to an opinion anymore either, please help. Roy

Dear Roy

I'm so sorry that your illness has impacted you so dramatically, you have had a lot of losses and that needs to be acknowledged. Work often gives us part of our identity as well as friends and colleagues. Losing that role plus having to cope with a debilitating condition has been a huge change in your life. Your wife has also been impacted by this new situation and she may be panicking that she has to carry it all alone. Perhaps she may need some reassurance that you are still here and still interested in both your futures and the challenges that may face you. You have a right to know exactly what the household financial situation is, and if possible you also need to have some money of your own to spend. Having a say and some control over your finances and major decisions that impact your life is essential and respectful in anyone's life. I hope you can have a meaningful conversation with your wife.

So sorry about your illness, you are suffering enough as it is. You both need to make decisions together. What is the prognosis of your illness is it likely to deteriorate further? Perhaps counselling is the best answer so you get the chance to say calmly how you feel & how taking away any financial independence is soul destroying for you.
